I hope this finds you well. I am writing to follow up on some of the recent announcements that you might have seen regarding *Lingua*.

As you might be aware, Johan Rooryck has recently communicated with us asking, among other things, that the ownership of *Lingua* be transferred to him and the other Editors, and that the journal be moved to a full 'gold' Open Access model.

As I was previously unaware of his concerns regarding these issues they came as something of a surprise, particularly given the previously positive collaboration that we have enjoyed over our ten-year relationship. I hope it will come as no surprise, however, that we are not able to agree to a transfer of Lingua's ownership to the editors. We have communicated this to Johan and the other Editors in a letter sent per his request on Friday 16/10.

As an Open Access publisher, we support initiatives that broaden access to scientific content. That's why*Lingua* (as with all the journals we own) already enables authors to publish their article Open Access with both 'green' and 'gold' options available. If you would like more information about the OA choices available to authors then I would be happy to send you this.

At this time, we continue to engage with the journal Editors and are obviously taking pains to ensure that the journal's day-to-day business remains unaffected. Ultimately; our chief concern and priority is ensuring that individual authors continue to receive, both now and in the future, the experience from *Lingua* that they expect: efficient, constructive and professional.
